

Message from the Chairman



Work Report of ELCSS-HK

Our new five-year plan for 2017 to 2022 aims to further expand in three directions – to make an impact, to break new ground and to take enhance execution. The key tasks accomplished in 2017-2018 are presented as follows:

1. Promoting advocacy

We continued to monitor and follow up on community and social welfare issues of relevance, such as estate management at Shan King Estate, Kwai Chung District Health Centre, social issues of particular interest to young people and Hong Kong Rehabilitation Programme Plan. Externally, we joined several sector alliances, such as the Social Welfare Alliance Against Poverty. Internally, we set up an advocacy fund to encourage and finance various units. The fund sponsored four projects to encourage young people and women in Kwai Chung, Sheung Shui, Tin Shui Wai and Tuen Mun to express their concerns about community issues.

2. Sharing professional services

We shared our experience of adopting the proven service models with peers on several occasions, such as 10th Anniversary Sharing Session on Heartstrings Music Therapy Service and Seminar on Trauma and Healing in Intimate Relationships, as well as practical experience at international seminars, such as the applications of narrative practice, the reflecting-team approach to rebuilding relationships between juvenile delinquents and society, and the applications of animal-assisted therapy.

3. Boosting collaboration in serving the community

We continued to promote a collaborative society by strengthening the ties between churches, social service units and schools in the same districts for establishing closer communications and relationships. The Gospel Development Foundation continued to encourage service units to carry out Gospel ministry by sponsoring a total of 36 projects involving 48 service units and 31 member churches

4. Building capacity

We put extra efforts into replacing the current financial management system to raise efficiency, save human resources and produce more comprehensive financial data. We also made good use of the data in our electronic human resources system for allocation and management of human resources, and formulation of future remuneration/benefit policies. We commenced a review of our workforce structure and remuneration packages to develop a remuneration policy for sustainable development.

Our Services



Early Childhood Education Service

Admissions of our nursery schools have remained stable since the government's implementation of the Free Quality Kindergarten Education Scheme in September 2017. Seven nursery schools saw continued improvements to their central curriculum by setting up language, art and science groups. Regular meetings were held to systematically integrate and conduct courses such as stroke ordering and emergent writing, art creation and natural science. Emphasis was placed on the mental health of children as well by hosting with Wong Choi Ming Joyful Family Nurturing Centre parent-child activities in March 2018, well attended by preschool kids and their family members. Workshop for New Preschool Teachers and New Staff Orientation were arranged for new recruits, while workshops on language teaching strategies and preschool education were hosted for retaining teachers. To promote full awareness of hygiene and safety in the teaching environment, staff workshops related to health training on prevention of disease and knowledge of occupational safety and health were arranged. Our joint school graduation ceremony² was held for 201 graduates on 3 July 2017 at Kwai Tsing Theatre.

Wong Choi Ming Joyful Family Nurturing Centre carried out preventive family education and community start-up projects catering for the "six critical years" of child development. Funded by the Community Chest and coordinated by the Centre, Happiness to Share: A Project on Nurturing of Happy Families, a three-year project, was kicked off in September 2017 with the launch of an array of community-based happy family development and support services across the territory to enhance family functions and develop a "happy family" network. Drawing some 500 participants, a major happy family campaign³ was staged on 24 February 2018 at the Peak and the Hong Kong Park to convey the importance of love and parentchild interaction. The Centre continued to provide stationing social work service to seven nursery schools and two kindergartens, and year-round on-the-spot support to some kindergartens. It also implemented a child care pilot scheme funded by the Social Welfare Department to enhance the parenting knowledge and skills of grandparents. Funded by The Tsu Te Kian Charitable Trust, support services for pupils suspected to have or diagnosed with Attention Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder and their parents were made available. A seminar-cum-pledge ceremony was held at the Lecture Hall of the Hong Kong Science Museum on 2 December, at which Dr. Chan Fung Ying, consultant of our Clinical Psychology Support Service, and Dr. Pau Yat Lun, our clinical psychologist, shared with over 200 attendees how to help pupils be more attentive and exercise better self-control through sports and mindfulness exercises.



Youth Service

We continued with our youth service featuring the theme of Dare to Dream, Live to Shine in line with the three areas of talent, family and youth participation. Sponsored by the Beat Drugs Fund, a Theatresports[™] Competition¹ was staged this year to convey anti-drug messages through performances. More than 6,000 teenagers from over 20 secondary schools have participated in the project so far. District competitions and territory-wide open competitions were held in December 2017 and March 2018 respectively, in which 27 teams comprising 127 teenagers participated.

This year's Step Showcase, a large-scale annual joint talent show hosted by the Youth Service, was held outdoors at the Hong Kong Cultural Centre in Tsim Sha Tsui on 25 March 2018, and attended by 165 teenagers. Themed Step Showcase Evolution², the show integrated dance, music, magic, jugaling and other talent elements. There were also booths for creative photography, popular handmade crafts, Indian painting, new sports experience, etc. We encouraged young people to care about our society. To this end, an intervention approach was adopted this year, with the launch of the first Escape Room X Youth Issues competition in October 2017 to encourage teenagers ponder on various issues, such as youth suicide, education and land policy, through different escape room games.

In light of ongoing concerns about mental health and suicide problems among young people in 2017, Share Respect for Life, Walk Together in Adversity Project – related to the Joyful@School Campaign sponsored by the Quality Education Fund was introduced in 15 secondary schools to promote the antiadversity and caring culture in schools and families. Various youth service units also stepped up their prevention and education services in their communities by launching

Our Services

Life Education Bi-weekly Event in November 2017 and February 2018. Our Hong Kong Youth Talent Institute also staged "Lily of the Valley" Life Education Drama from August 2017 to April 2018 in secondary schools and communities. Two special performances entitled "Lily of the Valley" Life Education Drama "The Fragile Butterfly" were held In April 2018 for parents, teachers and young workers at the Ngau Chi Wan Civic Centre to encourage people to reflect on the suicide problem among students.

With the sponsorship from the Jockey Club Charities Trust, our Career Development Service Team (New Territories West) for CLAP for Youth@JC Career & Life Adventure Planning carried out the Project YOU CAN, using narrative practice together with animalassisted therapy. Through an array of animal-assisted activities, such as sharing experience of interacting with animals, taking care of abandoned dogs and establishing relationships with dogs, we helped young people experience their sense of being. An anniversary seminar was held in June 2017 to share with peers the changes young people had experienced after participating in the project. The Integrated Service Centre for Reconciliation held a seminar on support services for young victims in September 2017, at which the effectiveness and experience of the Silver Lining Project were shared. A seminar on Trauma and Healing in Intimate Relationships was held in February 2018, at which a survey on young parents' life stress was published, and the experience related to trauma and forgiveness in intimate relationships, among others, was shared.



Elderly Service

We continued with our existing services and launched additional services successfully in 2017. Our regular services, including the home support services for elderly people discharged from hospitals for which we won the bidding in Shatin and Tuen Mun; introduction of the "Scheme on Home Care and Support for Elderly Persons with Mild Impairment" by our Integrated Home Care Services; introduction of the "Dementia Community Support Scheme" in Shatin and Ma On Shan for elderly people with dementia; internal realignment of the Carer Training Centre and expansion of "Easy Escort Services"; completion of renovation works at Kwai Chung Neighbourhood Elderly Centre; Yu Chui Neighbourhood Elderly Centre's extension of services to its branch centre in City One Shatin; and provision of Chinese medicine support services at nursing homes, were implemented during the year.

In terms of resource development, 13 special projects/services were financed by different funds during the year, including Lifestyle Reactivation Project: Jockey Club Smart Homecare Solution (HK\$17 million funded by the Hong Kong Chief Executive Fund), Jockey Club Age-friendly City Project - Experience Never Gets Old, daytime activities of Smart Club · Joyous Senior Life for people with dementia, Golden Library's school services, Enhancing Self-Reliance's Easy Escort Services, Smart Club's services sponsored by YSL Foundation, Project Legacy² – Support Service for Families with Grandparents as Parents funded by the Community Chest, as well as daytime and overnight one-stop services for residential care homes for elderly people.

Remarkable progress was also made in other fields in 2017. In particular, Men in Jazz, after its earlier performance at the Chiayi City International Band Festival in Taiwan,

embarked on a performance and exchange tour of Singapore, Malaysia and Brunei this year³. During the tour, the band was invited by the National Arts Council of Singapore to make a guest appearance at the Silver Arts Festival 2017. It was also the first Western-style band to perform in Brunei, which was highly valued and extensively covered by the local media. The band's director was also funded by the Hong Kong Arts Development Council to visit Singapore, Taiwan, the United States and Canada to study music development for people at golden age, and extended an invitation to Various Artists Saxophone Quartet (VASQ) from Poland to visit Hong Kong for musical exchange in October. Moreover, we summed up the decade-long experience of Heartstrings Music Therapy Service Programme by holding a professional sharing session featuring a decade's touching experience in music therapy. We were also invited to give a presentation on this programme at the World Congress of Music Therapy in Japan.

The promotion and development of our various services have received wide recognition from peers. During the year, we won numerous awards for our elderly services. For social enterprise operation, Essence Hub received an award in the Tithe Ethical Consumption Campaign in 2017 for a second year in a row as the most popular social enterprise among customers. Project Crossroad - Life & Death Education and Support Service for Frail Elders received the Top Ten Outstanding Service Award in the Best Practice Award in Social Welfare hosted by the Hong Kong Council of Social Service⁴. Two of our care workers received the Spirit in Care Work Award in recognition of their outstanding service and performance in the industry.

Our concerted efforts culminated in smooth execution and excellent performance in our work carried out in 2017. Looking forward to the coming year, the team will continue to encounter numerous potential crises and challenges, such as the weakening and aging of service recipients, acute shortage of care workers, heightened market-oriented service operations, frequent lodging of complaints against nursing homes. However, we are convinced that with the team's efforts and outstanding performance over the years, we can continue to deliver professional and quality services to meet the needs of elderly people.



Rehabilitation Service

Professional Chinese medicine practice and knowledge have been introduced into our rehabilitation services since 2015 through the Programme on Health Regimen for Mentally Handicapped Elderly covering six areas - the environment, daily life, diet, exercise, massage and acupuncture therapy as well as Chinese medicated diet. The programme was implemented in residential care homes for people with intellectual disabilities by adopting a modern nursing home management model. With the sponsorship from the Hong Kong Community Chest, a two-year project entitled Healthier Bone for Beautiful Community was rolled out during the year, which was Hong Kong's first-ever osteoporosis prevention and support scheme for those with intellectual disabilities and their caregivers. Under the scheme, 150 people with intellectual disabilities and their caregivers were recruited to undergo bone tests¹ and try out a medical procedure combining both Chinese and Western methods, such as taking glossy privet fruit powdered milk and receiving treatment using a high-frequency, low-amplitude interactive weight-bearing exercise machine, to improve bone density. A volunteer team was also set up to strengthen and broaden the community support network for people with intellectual disabilities and their caregivers to jointly cope with the challenge of aging.

Our Services

In addition to accommodating the needs arising from the aging of people with intellectual disabilities and their caregivers, we also placed emphasis on the opportunities for people with intellectual disabilities to unleash their potential. To this end, Be a Superstar II - Music Training Programme for People with Intellectual Disabilities² was hosted during the year to enable these people to showcase their musical talents and realise their selfworth. The programme featured Original Songs and Old Songs with New Lyrics competitions for the public to participate in, with A Positive Attitude Towards Life without Fear of Disabilities as the theme, to encourage the public to build an inclusive and caring community together.

The Kwai Chung District Support Centre³ was officially relocated to Luen Yuet House in Kwai Luen Estate in November 2017, and rendering services at the new premises was a move welcomed by all. Grace Rehabilitation Service and Kwai Shing Hostel also made arrangements for fire protection and building improvement works to comply with licensing requirements for hostels for those with disabilities, with works expected to commence by the end of 2018.



Drug Rehabilitation Service

In response to the recent changes in the types of drugs taken, the forms of taking drugs, and the needs for assistance from drug abusers, we must not only look at drug addiction in itself when dealing with drug abuse, but also assist drug abusers in coping with mental and psychological stress to help them regain the meaning of life.

Dr. Chan Ting Sam, professional consultant of the Hong Kong Institute of Educational Research at The Chinese University of Hong Kong, was invited to give our drug rehabilitation service workers a lecture on life review therapy aiming at personal reorientation during the year. This approach was successfully applied to drug abusers in helping them quit drugs.

During the year, seven Life Review experience camps¹ were arranged, in which 26 drug abusers shared how they reviewed their life. Although physically and mentally worn out by drugs, they understood why they live when revisiting their life journeys and 14 of them have decided to guit drugs and live afresh.

Thanks to the sponsorship from the Beat Drugs Fund, we launched a two-year social survey on Community Study on Drug Abusers of Methamphetamine in Hong Kong cum Exploratory Study of Chinese Medicine Treatment for Substance Abusers of Methamphetamine², with a focus on abuser

profile, usage pattern, health, psychological and social impacts as well as a preliminary study on using Chinese medicine for relief treatment of sequelae suffered by abusers of methamphetamine. The programme is still in progress, involving more than 50 participants, whose sleep disorders and emotional instability were improved through the treatment.

During the year, through holding the Live Afresh with New Attitude song and lyrics composition contest³ with 49 entries received, we hoped that ex-drug abusers could share their past struggles and obstacles, and community members could express to those afflicted souls their support and encouragement. Rev. Dennis Kiang and band Fabel were invited to serve as adjudicators for the finals to select outstanding works with positive messages to encourage more

There are many hidden chronic drug abusers and drug-abusing parents in the community, who are unwilling to seek assistance voluntarily. To address the problem, we will launch Operation of Networking Hidden Drug Abusers and My Love, I Care in the coming year, the main initiative of which is to offer early support to hidden drug abusers, drugabusing parents and their children through an outreach network.



Employment and Community Service

Grace Training and Development Centre has entered its 20th year of operation, with 18 training centres offering services in ten districts throughout the territory. Additional service centres were set up and new courses were offered to align with market needs on an ongoing basis. Foundation certificate programmes on Occupational Therapy Assistant and Physical Therapy Assistant were introduced during the year. The Centre received the Course Quality Assurance Award and ERB Employment Service Award from the Employees Retaining Board this year¹. Moreover, four of our instructors and students received ERB Outstanding Award for Instructors, ERB Outstanding Award for Trainees and ERB Merit Award for Trainees respectively, witnessing another recognition of the quality of our courses.

Kwai Chung Caring Network has been committing itself to offering support services to grassroots families in Tsuen Wan and Kwai Ching Districts by connecting the families in the community to form a mutual help network. Reading Partner Aunt², a picture book reading partner scheme which was vigorously expanded during the year, brought the joy and benefits of parent-child reading to the community. Moreover, we continued to show our care towards the health needs of grassroots women by setting up women's concern groups to voice their concerns.

Under the Integrated Employment Assistance Programme for Self-reliance, we launched a job-matching scheme vigorously during the year. This is a district-based scheme on searching companies and job vacancies to match jobs for job seekers in need, with 35 companies successfully recruited to register

in an employer network that offered more than 300 job vacancies. A small job fair was held every quarter, which was highly appreciated by employers and participants.

Grace Youth Camp, a cultural heritage conservation project on our institutional history, recorded more than 20,000 visits during the year. A Ma On Shan ecological conservation practice scheme funded by the Environment and Conservation Fund was launched this year, under which trained golden age guides conducted guided tours to enable the public to learn more about the unique natural geological and human historical knowledge of Ma On Shan. Moreover, the 2nd Hong Kong Mine Challenge was successfully held in February 2018. The theme of this year's contest focused on history, culture and conservation, attracting more than 170 teams comprising nearly 600 participants. Finally, Grace Youth Camp collaborated with Chung Hwa Book Company in publishing a book about the history of Ma On Shan Iron Mine, which is a collection of more than 30 former miners' stories telling the forgotten history of Hong Kong in the form of oral history.

During the year, the Professional Training Centre continued to deliver positive employee services as its principal focus, serving 5,140 participants and hosting various employee physical and mental health activities, such as leadership training in Laughter Yoga, Zentangle soul self-healing and so on, to draw employees' attention to their physical and mental health in a relaxed and lively way and to enhance their positive thinking to cope with the challenges of life.³




